Striped-tailed Scorpion (*Paravaejovis spinigerus*):

- Medium-sized light tan/yellow to brownish scorpions can reach up to 70 mm and 9.5 grams.
- Differing from the more common bark scorpion by its brownish-tan stripes on the back of its tail and keels or ridges.
- They feed on small invertebrates like roaches, crickets, termites, and other insects. So, they are good to have around.
- Lives under rocks and other surface objects and tends to seek humid areas.
- Although it is venomous, it is not considered dangerous to humans.
